1. Background

Developing appropriate organizational structure built around collectives of rural producers of Tasar silk, fostering individual entrepreneurship, or a combination of the two. Providing hand-holding support to Tasar Silk farmers' organization through business support and training.

2. Significant Accounting Policies:

a) Basis of preparation of Financial Statements

The current charge for Income tax is based on estimated tax liability as computed after taking credit for allowances and exemptions in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961 applicable for the period. In Accordance with the AS 22, Accounting for Taxes on Income, the company has provides for deferred tax liability for all temporary differences that arise in one accounting year and capable of reversal in subsequent accounting year. As a prudent policy, any deferred tax asset is not recognized.

i) Prior Period

Prior Period items are income or expenses which arise in the current period as a result of errors or omissions in the presentation of the financial statements of one or more prior periods. The nature and amount of prior period items should be separately disclosed in the statement of profit and loss in a manner that their impact on the current profit or loss can be perceived.
